FULBRIGHT GRANT ■ Monday, August 27, at 4:00 pm

Available to graduating seniors and graduate students who present a clear program of study to be carried out in a particular academic setting abroad. The grant allows students to conduct research or undertake advanced study or a teaching assistantship, for one year in a foreign country. Fluency in the host language is preferred, a strong background in American Culture and current events of the host country are critical in selection.

FELLOWSHIPS FOR GRADUATE STUDY IN THE UNITED KINGDOM ■ Tuesday, August 28, at 4:00 pm

The highly competitive Marshall, Rhodes, Gates-Cambridge, and Mitchell Scholarship competitions will be discussed. These fellowships cover one to three years of graduate study at various institutions in the UK. Each competition requires applicants to have a record of superior academic achievement, record of service and leadership, and be well informed on global issues. The University must nominate applicants in each competition.

JAVITS FELLOWSHIP ■ Tuesday, September 4, at 4:00 pm

Provides financial assistance to students of superior academic ability with demonstrated achievements, to undertake study at the doctoral and masters of Fine Arts (MFA) level in selected fields of the arts, humanities, and social sciences. USC Application Deadline: September 2007

UDALL SCHOLARSHIP ■ Wednesday, September 5, at 4:00 pm ■ West Quad Learning Center, Room 102*

One year of support for eligible expenses up to a maximum of \$5,000. Sophomores and juniors, who study the environment and related fields, or Native Americans and Alaska Natives who have outstanding potential and are in fields related to health care or tribal public policy. College GPA of at least a B or equivalent; must be nominated by the University. USC Nomination Deadline: October 25, 2007

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY (EPA) FELLOWSHIP ■ Thursday, September 6, at 4:00 pm

The U.S. EPA offers fellowships for undergraduate, masters, and doctoral level students in environmentally related fields of study. The Science to Achieve Results (STAR) program and Greater Research Opportunities (GRO) program which support master's and doctoral level students in the environmental fields of study will be discussed. TRUMAN SCHOLARSHIP ■ Monday, September 10, at 4:00 pm

Scholarships up to \$30,000 for graduate school. Juniors (any major) preparing for a career in public service; leadership abilities, academic performance and potential, community service records, and commitments to public service. Must be nominated by the University.

USC Application Deadline: October 10, 2007

NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION (NSF) GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP ■ Wednesday, September 12, at 4:00 pm

Three years of support (up to \$115,000) for study and research in the sciences or in engineering, leading to master's or doctoral degrees in the mathematical, physical, biological, engineering, behavioral, and social sciences, and in the history and philosophy of sciences. High GPA and high GRE General Test scores. Commitment to a career in research. Application Deadlines vary according to discipline in early November. Check www.fastlane.nsf.gov.

GOLDWATER SCHOLARSHIP ■ Monday, September 17, at 4:00 pm

Scholarship of \$7,500 for one to two years of undergraduate study. Sophomores and juniors pursuing bachelors' degrees in natural sciences, mathematics, or engineering; intent to earn a graduate degree in these fields to pursue a career in research and/or college-level teaching; strong GPA and research experience. Must be nominated by the University. USC Application Deadline: October 17, 2007

KNOWLES TEACHING FELLOWSHIP ■ Tuesday, October 9, at 4:00 pm

Graduating seniors and graduate students in science, engineering, or mathematics who want to teach high school science and/or mathematics are eligible. Knowles Fellows are supported professionally and financially for up to five years of graduate study and teacher preparation.

NATIONAL SECURITY EDUCATION PROGRAM (NSEP) ■ Wednesday, October 24, at 4:00 pm

NSEP supports outstanding undergraduate and graduate students who demonstrate high levels of academic performance and strong motivation to internationalize their education by developing expertise in the languages, cultures, and world regions less commonly studied by Americans.

Applicants must be evaluated by a University Committee in early January 2008.

ROTARY SCHOLARSHIP ■ Monday, November 12, at 4:00 pm

Scholars serve as ambassadors abroad while studying for one academic year or three months of language training. Any country where Rotary Clubs are located is considered. All class levels are eligible to apply. Application Deadline to local clubs: Spring 2008
