The Committee considered three items of business this year.

1. This item was a continuation from the previous year's committee work. A proposal from the Assistant/Associate Dean's Council would amend language in the Undergraduate Bulletin concerning course audits to require that students wishing to audit a course to attend at least 75% of the classes in order to receive credit. This would bring language concerning credit for auditing a class in the Undergraduate Bulletin in line with that in the Graduate Bulletin. This change was brought before the Faculty Senate at the June 26, 2002 meeting where it was approved.
2. The Committee was asked to review a proposed new policy from the University Athletics Advisory Committee dealing with excused student absences. Input from the committee was forwarded to the chair of that committee.
3. The Committee received a proposal for a change to the Undergraduate Bulletin, from the College of Nursing, to change the progression requirements for lower and upper division nursing from 2.50 to 2.75. The proposal was brought before the Faculty Senate at the June 25, 2003 meeting where it was approved.

Jane Olsgaard was re-elected chair of the Committee for 2003-2004. New members to the 2003-2004 committee are William Pelfry, College of Liberal Arts (Criminology and Criminal Justice) and Carl Evans, College of Liberal Arts (Religious Studies).
