SC ALCOHOL LAWS

- ✓ Minor in possession, purchase, consume or attempt to purchase beer or wine
 - \$465 or 30 days in jail or both
 - 120 day Drivers License Suspension 1st Offense
 - 1 year Drivers License Suspension 2nd Offense
 - Completion of an Alcohol Intervention Program
- ✓ Minor in possession, purchase, consume or attempt to purchase liquor
 - \$465 or 30 days in jail or both
 - 120 day Drivers License Suspension 1st Offense
 - 1 year Drivers License Suspension 2nd Offense
 - Completion of an Alcohol Intervention Program
- ✓ Transfer of beer to a minor
 - 1ST Offense \$672.50 or 30 days in jail or both
 - 2nd Offense \$1,087.50 or 30 days in jail or both
- ✓ Transfer of liquor to a minor
 - 1ST Offense \$672.50 or 30 days in jail or both
 - 2nd Offense \$1,087.50 or 30 days in jail or both
- ✓ Providing false information about age for purchase of beer
 - \$465 or 30 days in jail or both
 - 120 day Drivers License Suspension 1st Offense
 - 1 year Drivers License Suspension 2nd Offense
- ✓ Possession of an altered or other persons Drivers License/Identification Card
 - \$232.50 or 30 days in jail
 - 120 day Drivers License Suspension 1st Offense
 - 1 year Drivers License Suspension 2nd Offense
- ✓ Use of an altered, fake or other person's Drivers License/Identification Card
 - \$232.50 or 30 days in jail
 - 120 day Drivers License Suspension 1st Offense
 - 1 year Drivers License Suspension 2nd Offense
- ✓ Altering a DL/ID
 - \$5,237.50 or 6 months in jail or both
- ✓ Possession of a Keg without proper tag (As of January 1, 2008)
 - \$1,087.50 or 30 days in jail or both
- ✓ Removal of, alter, or obliterate a keg tag (As of January 1, 2008)
 - \$1,087.50 or 30 days in jail or both

Students convicted of alcohol or drug-related offenses may lose their scholarships including but not limited to need-based grants.
