ScienceDirect

Students and faculty at all USC campuses now have access to the ScienceDirect database online at <http://www.sciencedirect.com>. ScienceDirect offers comprehensive coverage of literature across all fields of science as well as materials on business and the social sciences. The database allows researchers to access the Elsevier Science journal collection (over 1,200 titles), along with journals from a host of prestigious societies and science, technical and medical (STM) publishers. Included in ScienceDirect are over 1.2 million full-text articles as well as indexing and abstracting coverage of over 30 million records.

Content:

The ScienceDirect collection from 1995 to present covers a wide variety of subject areas and disciplines, including:

chemistry	mathematics and computer science
materials science	earth sciences
engineering and technology	biochemistry
environmental science	microbiology and immunology
economics	biological sciences
business and management science	clinical medicine
neurosciences	arts and humanities
pharmacology and toxicology	social and behavioral sciences
physics	

Features:

1. Browse tables of contents, search lists, current and back issues of specific journals.
2. View SummaryPlus with an innovative article outline including an abstract as well as hyperlinks to references and thumbnail images and tables.
3. Search the full text of journals or abstracts (including the bibliographic layer) using basic or advanced search features.
4. Search across journal titles and the ScienceDirect Abstract Database.
5. Retrieve SummaryPlus or abstract, full article HTML or PDF articles.
6. Receive e-mail alerts that notify you when new material is added that matches your search profile.
7. Save searches to periodically recall a search for updated information.
8. Rank search results according to relevancy based on the frequency of the appearance of defined search terms and sorted in chronological order.

Getting Started:

1. Go to <http://www.sciencedirect.com>.
2. Click on Group-wide logon.
3. Chose Journals or Search.

1. Click on the HELP button at the top of each Web page.
2. Click on the word FEEDBACK at the bottom of each page to send questions, comments, or suggestions to ScienceDirect and receive an answer within 48 hours.
