The School of Visual Art and Design at the University of South Carolina invites applications for a non-tenure track Instructor to teach four courses per semester in Art Education. This is a nine-month appointment, beginning August 16, 2018 and ending May 15, 2019. This position may be renewable based on satisfactory performance, school needs, and the availability of funding. The salary is \$42,000.

The position requires an M.A., with a Ph.D. or ED.d. in Art Education preferred, and experience teaching on the K-12 level and in higher education. Courses for Fall 2018 will include ARTE 520 Art for Elementary Schools and ARTE 571, Directed Teaching in Art (internship in local schools), and its corresponding seminar, ARTE 565/765. Future teaching could also include ARTE 101, Introduction to Art, ARTE 260, Interdisciplinary Relationships in the Arts, and other courses as required.

All applicants **must** fill out an online application, submit a CV that includes a list of courses taught and names and contact information of three professional references, a teaching statement, and a research statement at USC Jobs: <https://uscjobs.sc.edu/>.

In addition, applicants **must submit** a single pdf file as an email attachment to artjobs@mailbox.sc.edu with a writing sample (an article or chapter), and up to 10 images/files of the candidate's creative work and up to 10 of student work.
