“Since China’s reform and opening began in 1978, it has emerged as a world-leading manufacturing and trading power. Since the 2008 Financial Crisis, however, falling overseas demand, rising domestic costs, the emergence of competitors in Southeast Asia, and technological change have all converged to challenged the hitherto smooth development

trajectory. The recent shifts in the global trading system from the US withdrawing from the Trans-Pacific Partnership to the recent reciprocal tariffs further suggest rocky shoals ahead. This talk will cover these topics and more, speculating on the future of the US-China economic relationship and the future of China’s influence in the global economy”
