

Graduate Assistantship in Music Entrepreneurship

Overview

Spark: Carolina's Music Leadership Laboratory seeks an outstanding graduate performer or composer with potential as a music entrepreneur/leader. Depending on qualifications, responsibilities may include assisting with classes, organizing and overseeing events, marketing, developing web/social media content, running the gig office, writing grants, and serving on a team charged with creating an entrepreneurial culture throughout and beyond the music school. This position requires up to 18 hours per week, and the nine-month stipend ranges up to \$6,000 (tuition abatements may boost the total value of the position beyond \$25,000). The assistant is expected to enroll in entrepreneurship courses each semester and will work closely with Dr. David Cutler, Director of Music Entrepreneurship (dcutler@mozart.sc.edu) and author of The Savvy Musician.
