

Graduate Assistantships in Classical Guitar

Responsibilities

The *Guitar Graduate Assistant* provides studio and class guitar instruction to nonmusic majors and lower-division music students and offers ensemble coaching. Responsibilities require 15 hours per week, and the nine-month stipend ranges from \$5,700 to \$6,300, depending upon degree status (tuition abatements may boost the total value of the position to \$20,000). Other assistantship may be available to qualified applicants. USC guitar students and recent graduates have distinguished themselves as recipients of major grants and awards, artists-in-residence for southern arts commissions, soloists with regional symphony orchestras, faculty members at U.S. universities, colleges, and conservatories, and as winners and finalists in major national and regional competitions, including the MTNA Collegiate Artist Auditions, Society of American Musicians Young Artist Competition, and the Schadt International String Competition.
