- 1. Regardless of individual course grades, students must maintain a minimum 2.50 GPA on all MUSC & MUED courses and a 2.00 cumulative GPA.
- 2. Some colleges require a minimum GPA for major courses. Courses indicated in this column are included in the major GPA for this program of study.

3. Students are required to participate in the major ensemble most closely related to their primary instrument. Students must declare a primary instrument upon acceptance into the program. Some ensembles require an audition for membership. Regulations for attendance at ensemble rehearsals & performances are different from regulations for class attendance. Members of ensembles are expected to be present at every rehearsal & performance, unless excused by the conductor. Courses which qualify for the Chamber Music requirement include all MUSC 130 courses with a suffix of A-Z and topics in: Voice, String, Percussion, Wind, Guitar, and Keyboard. Ensemble requirements are:

- a. Guitar: 2 major (usually choral), 6 guitar ensembles
- b. Jazz: 6 jazz ensembles, 2 major or minor jazz ensembles
- c. Organ: 4 major (usually choral), 4 accompanying
- d. Piano: 2 major, 2 accompanying, 2 chamber, 2 of choice
- e. String: 6 orchestra, 2 chamber
- f. Voice: 6 major, 2 opera workshop
- g. Wind/Percussion: 6 major, 2 chamber
- 4. MUED 155 and 156 are not required if taking MUSC 211P for Piano as primary instrument or if a student passes the proficiency exam.
- 5. Applied Music must be completed satisfactorily for a minimum of 8 semesters & 32 hours of credit.
- 6. Students in the Performance-Chamber Music concentration are required to demonstrate proficiency in one foreign language equivalent to the 122 course through course credit or the corresponding foreign language placement score.
- 7. The <u>Carolina Core</u> provides the common core of knowledge, skill and academic experience for all Carolina undergraduate students.
- 8. Concentration Electives: Students must complete a minimum of 13 hours of concentration electives, including MUED 155 & 156, if needed. Students whose primary medium is voice must complete MUSC 278, MUSC 577, and MUSC 543 or 545. Students must complete a pedagogy course in applied area when available. For Bachelor of Music candidates with an emphasis in performance, a half recital is required in the junior year & a full recital is required in the senior year, as well as selection of one of following options with its required electives:
 - a. Piano Pedagogy: MUSC 573-Performance Pedagogy (3); MUSC 573L-Pedagogy Lab. (2); MUSC 574-Performance Pedagogy II (3); MUSC 574L-Pedagogy Lab. (2); MUSC 575L-Pedagogy Lab. (2)
 - b. Piano Accompanying: MUSC 268-Keyboard Harmony & Sight Reading Lab. (1); MUSC 269-Beginning Piano Accompanying (1); and 3 courses chosen from the following: MUSC 543-Song Literature (3); MUSC 545-Survey of the Opera (3); MUSC 549-Survey of Chamber Music (3); MUSC 578-German and English Diction (2); MUSC 579-French Diction (2)
- 9. Chamber Music Electives include: another 3 hours of MUSC 130 or select one from: MUSC 580, 591, 593, or 594.
- No courses of a remedial, developmental, skill-acquiring, or vocational nature may apply as credit toward degrees in the School of Music. The School of Music allows the use of the Pass-Fail option on elective courses. Further clarification on inapplicable courses can be obtained from the School of Music.

Program Notes:

- Courses identified as "critical" have a deadline for completion. ENGL 101 & 102 must be completed within the first 60 semester hours of work in order to be credited toward graduation. MUSC courses identified as "critical" must be completed in order to be admitted to the upper division.
- To be admitted to the upper division, students must meet the following criteria: 1) completion of Piano proficiency requirements; 2) successful completion of a barrier jury on their primary instrument; 3) completion of Aural Skills training sequence (MUSC 117, 118, 217, 218); 4) completion of music theory sequence (MUSC 115, 116, 215, 216); and 5) completion of at least 60 credits with a cumulative grade point average of 2.50 in MUSC & MUED courses and 2.00 in all courses.
- All undergraduate students must take a 3-credit course or its equivalent with a passing grade that covers the founding documents. This course may fulfill any requirement in the program of study. Courses that meet this requirement are listed in the academic bulletin.
