- 1. Regardless of individual course grades, students must maintain a minimum 2.000 cumulative GPA.
- 2. Some programs require a minimum GPA for major courses. Courses indicated in this column are included in the major GPA for this program of study.
- 3. Students who do not place into MATH 122 or 141 will be required to take the required prerequisite before proceeding with MATH 122 or 141. The student's choice of interdisciplinary studies path will determine which math course is applicable to the program of study.
- 4. Students in the College of Arts and Sciences are required to demonstrate proficiency in one foreign language equivalent to the 122 course through course credit or the corresponding foreign language placement score.
- 5. The <u>Carolina Core</u> provides the common core of knowledge, skill and academic experience for all Carolina undergraduate students. Specific courses may be required to meet some Carolina Core requirements depending upon the interdisciplinary studies path chosen.
- 6. Each student must complete a program of studies designed by an interdisciplinary program committee appointed by the College Academic Affairs and Advising Office. The program shall include a minimum of 36 semester hours of credit in major eligible courses in two or more fields. No course submitted in fulfillment of the general education requirements may be included in the program requirements. A maximum of 15 semester hours of independent study courses may be applied to the interdisciplinary studies program requirement.
- 7. The cognate is intended to support the course work in the major. The cognate must consist of twelve hours of courses at the advanced level, outside of, but related to the major. In place of a cognate, a student may choose a minor consisting of at least 18 credit hours of courses concentrated in one area that follow a structured sequence. All minor courses must be passed with a grade of C or higher. For B.S. degrees, grades of D are acceptable for completion of the cognate requirement. A second major eliminates the minor/cognate requirement.
- 8. The College of Arts and Sciences requires one U.S. History and one non-U.S. History course, both of which must be chosen from the approved Carolina Core GHS courses. Whichever is not fulfilled through the Carolina Core GHS requirement must be fulfilled through this college requirement.
- 9. No courses of a remedial, developmental, skill-acquiring, or vocational nature may apply as credit toward degrees in the College of Arts and Sciences. The College of Arts and Sciences allows the use of the Pass-Fail option on elective courses. Further clarification on inapplicable courses can be obtained from the College of Arts and Sciences. The number of approved electives applicable to the program of study may depend upon the path chosen for the interdisciplinary studies major.

Program Notes:

- Courses identified as "critical" must be completed in the student's first 60 semester hours of work in order for these courses to be credited toward graduation.
- All undergraduate students must take a 3-credit course or its equivalent with a passing grade that covers the founding documents. This course may fulfill any requirement in the program of study. Courses that meet this requirement are listed in the academic bulletin.
- To be considered for this major, a student must have a 3.0 GPA and 30 hours earned at USC.
- The following procedures shall be followed in designing a program of interdisciplinary studies:
 - o The candidate shall apply to the College Academic Affairs and Advising Office for declaration of an interdisciplinary studies program.
 - The candidate must submit to the College Academic Affairs and Advising Office a written statement of goals concerning a potential interdisciplinary studies program.
 - The College Academic Affairs and Advising Office will help the candidate formulate an interdisciplinary program committee, which shall consist of
 faculty members from the student's areas of interdisciplinary interest. The members of the interdisciplinary program committee shall be appointed
 by the College Academic Affairs and Advising Office, who will designate one member as chair and as the student's academic advisor.
 - The interdisciplinary program committee shall meet with the student and prepare a program of studies leading to the Bachelor of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies. This program shall include a written justification for the specific program of studies designed with the student. The program of study must be approved by the committee prior to the completion of 75 hours. The committee and College Academic Affairs and Advising Office must approve any subsequent changes in the student's program.
 - The candidate's academic advisor shall advise the student each semester and shall sign the necessary registration and other advisor's forms.
 Advising shall adhere to the student's approved program of studies. The academic advisor shall consult with the interdisciplinary program committee for approval should deviation from the original program become necessary or advisable. All changes shall be registered with the College Academic Affairs and Advising Office.
- The last 30 credit hours toward your degree must be earned in residence at the University of South Carolina-Columbia.
