- 1. Regardless of individual course grades, students must maintain a minimum 3.000 cumulative institutional GPA. One below C grade is allowed in a required science or nursing (NURS) course to remain eligible for the major. However, students must earn a minimum grade of C in all required courses for the BSN program in order to continue with the curriculum and graduate.
- 2. Some colleges require a minimum GPA for major courses. Courses indicated in this column are included in the major GPA for this program of study.
- Students who do not place into the required ARP courses must complete the necessary prerequisites before continuing with the required Carolina Core
  ARP courses.
- 4. The Carolina Core provides the common core of knowledge, skill and academic experience for all Carolina undergraduate students.
- 5. Students in the College of Nursing are required to demonstrate proficiency in a foreign language by achieving a score of two or higher on the Foreign Language Placement Test or by completing one foreign language through 110 or 121.
- 6. NURS 220 must be completed with a C or better grade prior to starting upper division coursework.

## **Program Notes:**

- Students must have a "C" or better grade in all critical courses and a cumulative 3.000 or higher progression and institutional GPA in order to be eligible to apply to Upper Division. Grade forgiveness will not be recognized in the GPA calculation.
- Acceptance into the University with a lower-division classification does not guarantee progression into the upper-division nursing major. Students
  enrolled in the lower division must meet minimum upper division admission standards set forth by the College of Nursing (see Bulletin listing). Once
  minimum criteria are met, all qualified applicants are placed into an applicant group and are evaluated, using the same criteria, by their progression
  grade point averages and essay and/or interview criterion for a total evaluation metric. Based on the number of available seats and available clinical
  sites, students are admitted based on results of the total evaluation metrics.
- All undergraduate students must take a 3-credit course or its equivalent with a passing grade that covers the founding documents. This course may fulfill any requirement in the program of study. Courses that meet this requirement are listed in the academic bulletin.
- The last 30 credit hours toward your degree must be earned in residence at the University of South Carolina-Columbia.
