Students will be provided with career outcomes data to help them make more informed career decisions.

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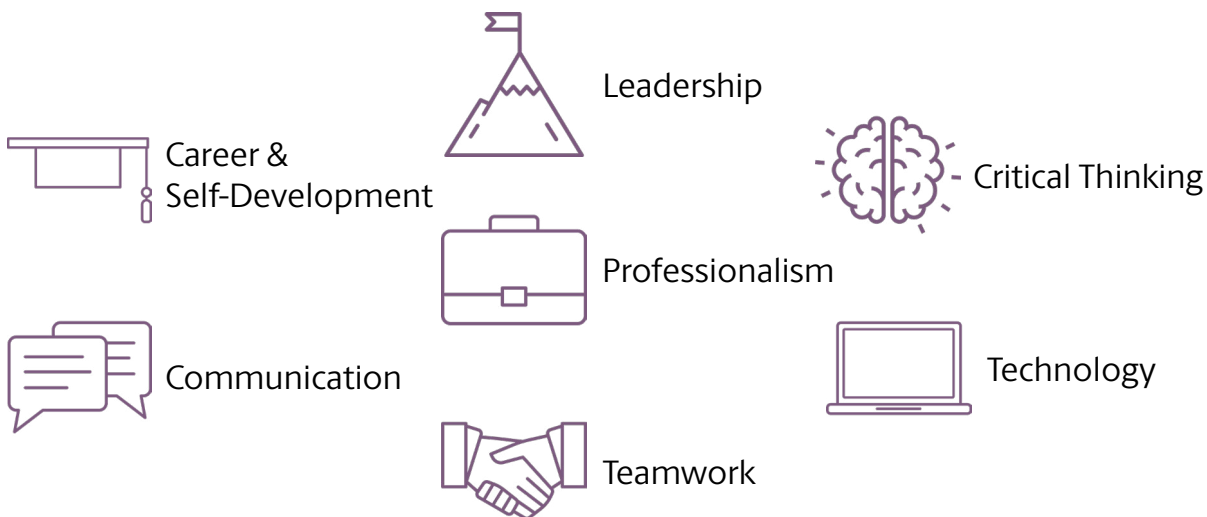

Career readiness is all about building the skills and confidence you'll need to succeed — not just in your first job, but throughout your whole career. These are career readiness competencies employers look for:

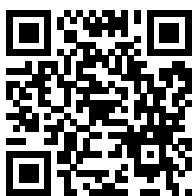


Career Center Faculty Engagement Menu

These experiences — whether internships, research, clinical placements, practicums, or student teaching — also build skills you'll use throughout your career.

Incorporating Career Readiness into Your Syllabi

National research shows that students who receive career guidance from their faculty experience stronger career mobility and confidence after graduation. One powerful way to support your students is by helping them see how the work they're doing in your course connects to their future career plans. You can make these connections clear in your syllabus through statements, assignments, activities, and resource links — all without changing your existing curriculum.

A helpful first step is identifying which of the NACE Career Readiness Competencies your course already develops. Once you've pinpointed those skills, you can highlight them throughout your syllabus using the examples provided below.

We also encourage you to refer students to the University of South Carolina Career Center for additional support. Our team can help them translate the skills they're gaining in your class into strong applications, résumés, interviews, and graduate school materials. If your syllabus includes a student resources section, consider adding some or all of the items listed later in the Example Resources section.

Example Syllabus Statement 1

This course will provide you with the development of the following essential skills: [insert relevant skill(s)]. These essential skills will help prepare you for future career opportunities including internships, jobs, and graduate school. Example Syllabus Statement 2

Essential Skills Developed:

Communication: This course will build your verbal communication skills through weekly discussions on assigned readings. You will also have several presentations where you will share your research with the class. You will develop written communication skills through assignments including weekly reflections and a final paper.

Teamwork: This course will build your teamwork skills during your final paper/presentation assignment where you will work with a team to write a paper on a research topic and present your findings together to the class.

Example Assignments & Activities



Communication

Clearly and effectively exchange information, ideas, facts, and perspectives with others.

Examples: Writing papers and professional messages, presenting to the class or guests, discussing course topics with peers, creating presentation visuals, asking clarifying questions, practicing active listening, applying storytelling techniques, developing an elevator pitch.



Teamwork

Build and maintain collaborative relationships to work toward shared goals while valuing diverse viewpoints.

Examples: Group projects, partner lab work, co-writing assignments, adapting and compromising, managing conflict effectively.



Critical Thinking

Identify and respond to needs using situational context and logical analysis.

Examples: Solving course-related problems, gathering and interpreting data, engaging in debates, analyzing case studies, writing research papers, participating in service-learning projects, considering diverse perspectives.



Leadership

Recognize and use personal and team strengths to achieve goals.

Examples: Planning and completing projects, solving problems creatively, evaluating peer work, building trust, motivating teammates, practicing ethical decision-making.



Professionalism

Demonstrate effective work habits and act responsibly within the academic or workplace community.

Examples: Meeting deadlines, attending class on time, upholding academic integrity, submitting error-free work, holding oneself and others accountable, reporting progress updates.



Technology

Use technology ethically and effectively to complete tasks and achieve goals.

Examples: Creating digital presentations, learning new tools, selecting appropriate technologies for tasks, manipulating information, understanding data privacy and security, teaching others how to use new technology.



Career & Self Development

Proactively develop one's skills, knowledge, and career awareness.

Examples: Identifying strengths and areas for growth, applying feedback, seeking learning opportunities, using career assessments, exploring career paths, connecting with professionals, creating career materials (résumé/CV, cover letter, personal statement).
