What you do affects performance for those around you. Being a good Wi-Fi citizen is about helping everyone around you get the connection they need.

CHOOSE YOUR CONNECTION WISELY

Use the uscstudent Wi-Fi network

It is the fastest and most secure wireless network at UofSC.

Don't use personal routers or hotspots

Personal wireless routers have a negative impact on the uscstudent network in resident halls. In some cases, these rogue access points make campus Wi-Fi unusable by all.

Stop sending mixed signals

Because Wi-Fi uses a range of radio frequencies that are unregulated and available for public use, many electronic devices and appliances can cause interference and degrade the UofSC Wi-Fi Networks.

Don't bring wireless printers to campus



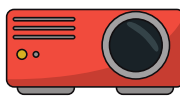





Wireless printers are not permitted in the dorms. Most wireless printers can use a wired connection to your printer. Wireless printing can lead to substantial interference.

Game by wire

Wireless gaming console controllers use the same spectrum as the campus Wi-Fi network, causing significant interference. Use wired controllers whenever possible.

Manage other sources of wireless interference

Wi-Fi can be negatively affected by a number of regular things: microwave ovens, wireless audio speakers, cameras, clocks and projectors.

CRITICAL	 Microwave Ovens	Keep microwaves away from computers
	 Wireless Routers	Don't use or bring your own wireless routers
SEVERE	 Wireless Projectors & Cameras	Use wired devices
	 Wireless Printers	Connect directly using USB cable
	 Wireless Speakers	Use wired speakers or headsets
MEDIUM	 Wireless Gaming Controllers	Keep devices powered off when not in use
	 Bluetooth Devices	Keep devices powered off when not in use
MODERATE	 Certain Computer Displays	Keep monitors powered off when not in use
