Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

The Federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, or FERPA, establishes the regulations regarding access to and disclosure of student records. To fulfill FERPA requirements, the



university has established Policies on Student Records. These policies outline a student's rights regarding their records, where records about the student may be kept and maintained, what kinds of information are in those records, the conditions under which the student or anyone else may have access to information in those records, and what action a student can take if the information in their record is inaccurate or that the student's rights have been compromised.
