

1	Executive Privilege	president's refusal of subpoenas about private communications if it interferes with executive branch functioning.
2	White House Plumbers	men who spied on & sabotaged Nixon's opponents & stopped press leaks (associated w CREEP).
3	Deep Throat	anon source (later revealed as FBI director), supplied reporters Bob & Carl about the White House's involvement in Watergate's break-in.
4	Saturday Night Massacre	October 20, 1973. Nixon wanted to fire the prosecutor who investigated the Watergate scandal, Attorney General Richardson & Deputy Attorney General William Ruckelshaus refused and resigned.
4	Who wasn't indicted for the Watergate scandal?	Bob Woodward.
5	Pentagon Papers	leaked government documents that changed the public's view of Vietnam War.
6	Vietnamization	Nixon turning Vietnam war over to South Vietnam.
7	Kent State University Demonstration of 1970	protested the invasion of Cambodia by U.S. forces.
7	Recognizing change in public opinion, in 1971 Nixon...	repealed the Gulf of Tonkin Resolution.
8	Nixon's Bold Diplomatic Step in 1972	met with Chinese leaders in Beijing.
9	Carter's campaign promise...	he would never lie.
9	Why did Carter deregulate US industries?	to encourage competition.
10	Carter Doctrine	interfering with US interests in the middle east seen as aggressive & met with force.
10	Camp David Accords	Israel & Egypt
11	Why were the Korean & Vietnam wars illegitimate?	did not involve a formal declaration of war by Congress.
12	Helsinki Accords	agreement Ford signed with USSR leader to end territorial issues post-WWII.
13	Détente	relaxed tensions between US & USSR.
14	Yippies	Youth International Party, wanted New Nation with cooperative institutions to replace current ones.
14	Dixiecrats	racist conservative south Democrats.
14	Southern strategy	appeal to southern whites by opposing civil rights advancements.
15	Silent Majority	majority whose political will isn't heard & opinions overlooked (north white blue-collar voters).
16	Identity Politics	further interests of a particular group (culture, race, religion, orientation, etc).
17	"The Feminine Mystique"...	encouraged people to rethink the roles of women
17	Moral Majority's main goal	encouraging Judeo-Christian values.
