BACKGROUND

University of South Carolina students must be aware of contemporary world issues, with an appreciation for the historical context as well as the natural, material, and socio-cultural forces that shape these issues. They must recognize and appreciate diversity as a characteristic of South Carolina, the nation, and the world, and understand self within that context. Such perspectives underlie the ability to interact effectively with people from diverse cultural backgrounds.

Instructor Role

Your role is to select an assignment that could be scored by the <u>GSS Rubric</u>, which measures the extent to which students meet the three student achievements discussed in the previous section. During the semester that your course is selected for assessment, you will administer the assignment, collect, and grade as usual. You will then submit the grades and assignments to OIRAA, which will then be scored by trained external reviewers using the GSS rubric. Assessment results will be returned after all GSS rating has been completed.
