## 10.1 Academic Policies

- 10.1 The institution publishes, implements, and disseminates academic policies that adhere to principles of good educational practice and that accurately represent the programs and services of the institution.  
*(Academic policies)*

### Compliance

The Off-Site Reaffirmation Committee found support for the institution's case for compliance.

The main campus and the regional campuses have established, elected bodies that produce academic policies for senior administrator approval. Faculty manuals for all sites, the Policies and Procedures Manual, and the academic bulletins from various academic units are all readily available online. The institution's UNIV 1.00 Policy on Policies: Development and Oversight of University Policies, which has been recently updated, provides clear guidance for how policy approval processes work. The institutional policies website documents policies that are under review and offers campus constituents the opportunity to comment.

Policies are published both by central administration and by colleges and schools, which have authority to develop policies that are relevant to their programs. The institution references the applicability of policies to distance education and dual enrollment. Dissemination of policies is documented in the minutes of the Senate. Processes for policy implementation and dissemination are in alignment with those of peer institutions.

The commitment to representing the programs and services of the institution through academic policies is underscored by the ability of the regional campuses to have individual bulletins that address their concerns.
