Dr. Lara Lomicka Anderson (Ph.D., Penn State) currently serves as Vice Provost and Dean of Undergraduate Studies, and as Interim Vice Provost for Graduate Studies and Dean of the Graduate School at the University of South Carolina. She is a Professor of French and Applied Linguistics and her research focuses on computer-assisted language learning. She holds the titles of *Chevalier dans l'ordre des palmes académiques* and Jessie Chapman Alcorn Memorial Professor of Foreign Languages. Additionally, she served as a Pearce Faculty Fellow with the USC Honors College and is the Past President of CALICO, NFMLTA, and AAUSC. She serves as Associate Editor for *Language Learning & Technology* and past Associate Editor of *JALT-CALL*. Her research combines elements of intercultural learning, social media, study abroad, interactive mapping and digital semiotics as they relate to language learning. She has published widely in reputable venues, and she has co-edited two books on technology and language learning, an edited special issue of *Language Learning and Technology* (2023), and a recently published book, *The Faculty Factor* (2023), which explores the roles of faculty in residential learning communities. Lara regularly conducts workshops, consults with language programs, and gives talks on technology in language teaching throughout the United States and internationally.
