Dr. Steven P. Girardot is the Vice Provost for Undergraduate Education and Student Success at the Georgia Institute of Technology (Georgia Tech), where he oversees all aspects of undergraduate education, including undergraduate advising, experiential learning, career development, academic success, general education, and academic policies for undergraduates.

He holds a B.S. in Chemical Engineering and an M.S. in Chemistry from Georgia Tech. He earned a Ph.D. in Chemistry and an MPH in Epidemiology from Emory University, and his research and scholarship were at the intersection of chemistry and environmental health. He has over 25 years of experience in higher education and has previously held leadership roles in K-12 programs, academic success, student affairs, and graduate student development at Georgia Tech. He has taught undergraduate classes in chemistry, epidemiology, and every year continues to co-teach a section of Georgia Tech's first-year seminar, GT 1000.

Dr. Girardot is an active presenter and contributor at national conferences and organizations related to undergraduate education and student success, serving as conference chair, associate regional vice president, and past president of the North American Association of Summer Sessions (NAASS); a founding member of Penguin Random House's Higher Education Common Reading Advisory Board; and is currently on the advisory board for the National Resource Center for the First-Year Experience and Students in Transition and President-elect of the Association for Undergraduate Education in Research Universities (UERU).
