Academic Disruption



What is Academic Disruption?

Disorderly Conduct

Classroom behavior that disrupts the instructor's ability to teach or students' ability to learn.

Disruptive Activity

Students are expected to comply with and respond appropriately to the reasonable and lawful requests of University officials in the performance of their duties.

Failure to Comply

Disruption of the normal activity and operations of faculty, staff, and students.



How should I handle Academic Disruption?



- · Add into your syllabus a statement regarding behavioral expectations in your classroom
 - See sample syllabus statements on our website
- Discuss classroom expectations at the beginning of class and when relevant

2 If an Incident Occurs

Address the behavior in person



Explain the impact of the behavior



Request that the behavior stops



Explore alternatives to behavior



Refer the student to an appropriate resource

- Fill out an incident report at sc.edu/osc
 - This notifies the Office of Student Conduct
 - Make sure to notify your dean and department head
