Spanish in South Carolina.*



Spanish exploration and settlement during the 16th century resulted in a tenuous claim by Spain to the area now known as South Carolina. Explorers and colonists alike traversed the state and settled the coast between 1521 and 1587. Historical research and archaeological investigations at Santa Elena in Beaufort County, South Carolina have provided a look into daily life at the capitol of Florida during the interval of A.D. 1566-1587.
