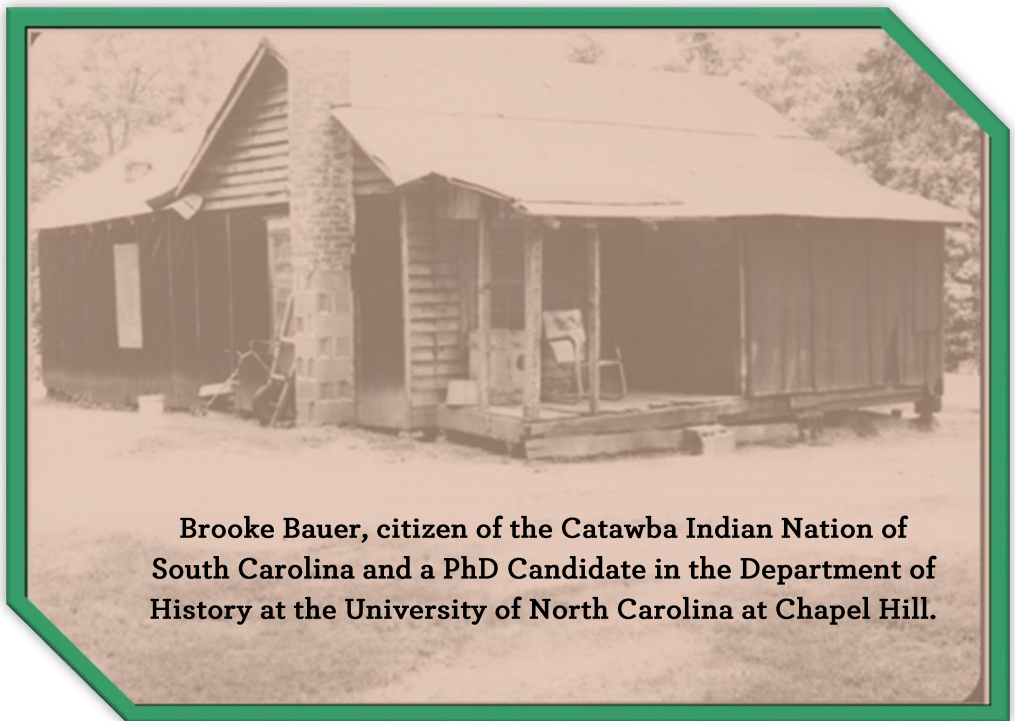

Conveyors of Culture:

A Lineage of Catawba Women Potters, 1829-2015

Lecture by Brooke Bauer



Brooke Bauer, citizen of the Catawba Indian Nation of South Carolina and a PhD Candidate in the Department of History at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

This lecture covers the creation of Brooke Bauer's exhibit that traces the lineage of Catawba women potters from the Ayers/George/Brown/Harris families. Brooke conceived of this exhibit as an extension of her research on eighteenth and early nineteenth century Catawba women. Her exhibit groups certain forms of pottery made by women within her family to highlight how the building of these pieces remained unaltered through several generations.
