Cornwallis in Present-Day Lancaster and York Counties

In the past 15 years, much detail of Revolutionary War events has been discovered with significant precision. This advance is due to the digitalization of original records, the efficient search of Internet resources, and a cadre of dedicated individuals who have taken advantages of these tools with the goal of understanding what actually happened. The fruits of this research, as applied to Cornwallis's march through present-day Lancaster and York Counties will be presented. Many historical sites will be mentioned that can be visited today.
