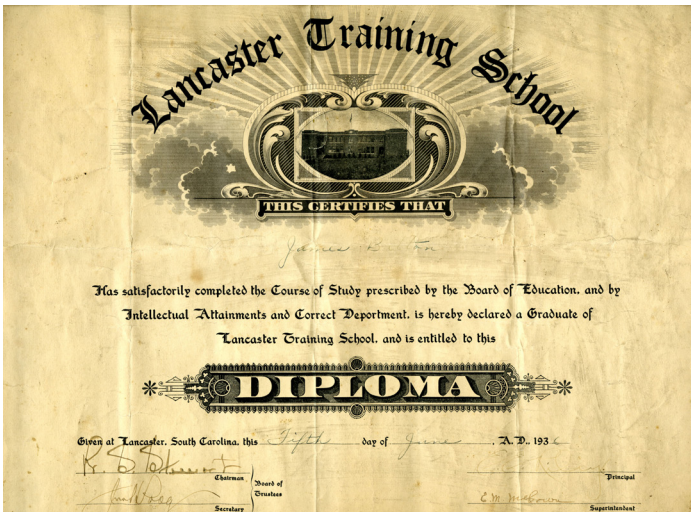
All are invited to attend these free monthly lectures which usually cover topics related to local and regional culture and history.

“Desegregating Lancaster: An Oral History Project”

Last summer, a group of USCL researchers received funding from the University and the J. Marion Sims Foundation to collect oral histories on the era of desegregation in the Lancaster area. Since then USCL faculty, staff and students have been recording stories from members of the Lancaster community. In this presentation, we’ll
