You must complete all forms in this packet to be evaluated for South Carolina Lottery Tuition Assistance Eligibility.

"Dually Enrolled High School Student - Students Form":

You, the student, must complete this form.

You must include your full name and VIP ID (this was on your admissions letter).

You must provide an address where you can receive mail, in case we need to reach you.

You must provide the name of your High School

Read every line of this form before you sign it.

To be eligible for Lottery Tuition Assistance you must be in at least 6 hours in that term.

"Dually Enrolled High School Student - School Form":

The Appropriate High School Representative must complete this form.

Indicate how many credit hours of dual-enrollment in each semester the student is expected to be enrolled.

To be eligible for Lottery Tuition Assistance in a semester, the student must be in 6 credit hours (2 classes).

The Appropriate High School Representative must sign this form.

Other Requirements:

You must be admitted.

You must complete the Admissions Application.

You must be a U.S. Citizen or Eligible Non-Citizen.

To document this you must complete the Citizenship Form provided with the Admissions Application.

You must be a South Carolina Resident (for tuition and fees purposes).

To document this you must complete the" SC Residency Certification Form for Dependent Students." This was also provided with the Admissions Application.

DUAL ENROLLMENT AND FINANCIAL AID

When students take college level courses while still in high school it can have some impact upon financial aid, both state and federal. Students should be aware of the following points as they consider taking classes:

Can Financial Aid help pay for Dual-Enrollment courses?

Yes, but only with Lottery Tuition Assistance for SC Residents.

Only South Carolina Residents can receive State Lottery Tuition Assistance.

The student must take at least 6 credit hours (2 classes) of dual-credit classes per semester.

The student receives a tuition reduction up to \$95 per credit hour.

Since Dual-enrollment classes are currently less than this, the entire tuition is covered.

To be eligible students must complete an application packet.

Dual-enrollment students are not eligible for any other federal or state aid.

Will making bad grades in these courses affect my future financial aid eligibility?

Yes, students must make at least a "C" average to be eligible for financial aid.

Students must be meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards to be eligible.

The student must have a a 2.0 GPA ("C" average) on all college classes.

The student must pass 67% of all attempted courses. This includes dual-enrollment courses.

If a student fails or drops a dual-enrollment class he will likely lose financial aid eligibility.

If the student has lost financial aid eligibility, he can write an appeal letter explaining the academic deficiency, why it occurred and what changed that shows improvement.

If the appeal is approved the student could regain eligibility for financial aid.

NOTE: Scholarships are not affected by this in the first year of college (see below).

Will taking Dual-Enrollment courses affect my scholarships?

Yes, but probably not in your first year of college.

Scholarships for your Freshman year of college only look at your High School GPA.

If these course grades are included in your High School GPA then they might affect eligibility.

LIFE Scholarship specifically requires a 3.00 or better on the SC UGS GPA (with some exceptions).

At the end of your first year of college only your collegiate GPA is considered.

This would include the GPA on the courses you took in high school.

You must also earn 30 hours at the end of your first year of college.

Dual-Enrollment courses are included in those 30 hours.

<u>If you are an Early High School Graduate</u>, receiving Lottery Tuition Assistance in the Fall semester of your Senior year can prevent you from receiving LIFE scholarship in the Spring. Instead *your first term of LIFE eligibility would be Fall of your first-full-year of college*.

Lottery Tuition Assistance (LTAP) is awarded based on the number of credit hours you are enrolled each semester at no more than the state approved rate per credit hour. You must enroll for at least 6 credit hours each semester at a single institution to receive Lottery Tuition Assistance. Lottery Tuition Assistance is a tuition reduction program and as such you cannot receive a refund check from this award. Be a U.S. citizen or a permanent resident that meets the definition of an eligible non-citizen under State residency statutes. Be a legal resident of South Carolina as defined in applicable State statutes governing the determination of residency for tuition and fee purposes for at least one year to be eligible for LTAP.

By signing below, you are confirming that you have read and agree with the following statements:

I hereby request a waiver to the Lottery Tuition Assistance eligibility requirement relating to the submission of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the following reasons. By not submitting the FAFSA, I acknowledge that:

- I am a high school student enrolled in a dual enrollment program with the intent to earn a college degree after high school.
- I will not be eligible to receive other Title IV aid, which includes the Federal Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant, Perkins Loan, Federal Direct Loans, Federal Work Study and the SC Need-Based Grant.
- I will not be able to participate in other loan programs offered by the South Carolina Student Loan Corporation or other state assistance programs that require the submission of the FAFSA.
- I understand that neither the state of South Carolina nor the institution can be held liable for any amount of federal or state funds that I forgo by signing this waiver.
- I do not owe a refund or repayment of a state grant, Federal Pell Grant, or Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant, and I am not in default on a loan under the Federal Perkins Loan, Federal Direct Loan, or any state loans. I understand that the institution will verify this.
- Male Students Only: I have registered with the Selective Service or I have been exempted from this requirement according to federal law. I understand that students who fail to register with the Selective Service or fail to be exempt from that requirement are not eligible to receive Lottery Tuition Assistance.
- This waiver is not valid until all requested documentation is provided to the Financial Aid Office, and all documentation has been verified.

I also hereby certify that, as a Lottery Tuition Assistance recipient,

- I am not a recipient of the HOPE, LIFE, or Palmetto Fellows Scholarship during this academic year (though I am not forgoing my eligibility after High School Graduation).

- I am not in default on a Federal or State student loan or owe a refund to a Federal or State student grant.
