Executive Summary

The University of South Carolina Sumter is a two-year regional campus whose purpose is to provide higher education opportunities and intellectual leadership for the counties of Clarendon, Lee, Kershaw, Sumter, and Williamsburg. USC Sumter employs a teaching faculty of high quality, dedicated to excellence in instruction, scholarship, public and professional service, and creative endeavor enriching the classroom experience. The curriculum, grounded in the liberal arts, focuses on preparing students to continue their education in the University and throughout life. USC Sumter offers associate level degrees and pro-actively recruits students prepared to succeed in completing a baccalaureate-level education.

USC Sumter has maintained its commitment to a faculty of high quality as organizational restructuring, budgetary constraints and faculty attrition have put numerous pressures on organizational resources. This commitment continues to yield tangible results in several measures of student accomplishment, including rates of persistence, transfer and success, and baccalaureate completion. It also continues to yield tangible results in faculty accomplishment in scholarship and service.

Mission Statement

Enrollment varies with community need, but is expected to remain at approximately 1200 students. The University of South Carolina Sumter was established to encourage higher education in the counties of Clarendon, Lee, Kershaw, Sumter, and Williamsburg. The original design of the institution incorporated a flexibility that has allowed changes in institutional capability with increasing educational demands of constituents.

The institution awards the Associate in Arts and Associate in Science degrees and provides for the completion of selected bachelor's degrees on campus through cooperative agreements and delivery structures with other USC System institutions. USC Sumter also provides general education and upper division coursework applicable to baccalaureate degree programs offered through colleges and universities nationwide. In addition to academic coursework, the mission of the campus includes noncredit courses, seminars, and workshops made available to the community for cultural enrichment and professional development.

The traditions of cultural diversity and freedom of thought are valued at USC Sumter. In a learning environment that develops respect for racial, geographical, intellectual, and economic diversity and an awareness of individual, societal, and global responsibilities, USC Sumter promotes courses, activities, and attitudes which influence the life of the mind in men and women and instill in them a thirst to continue learning throughout life.

USC Sumter emphasizes the development of the whole person and especially seeks to foster in students the disciplines essential to an educated citizenry. Core competencies, including the ability to communicate through effective writing and articulate speech; computational and quantitative mastery; creative and critical thinking; and the duties of citizenship are strategically integrated within the curriculum. Classroom experiences, student activities, and physical education programs also provide opportunities for cultural enrichment, leadership development, intellectual growth and interpersonal relationships, all contributing to a sense of self-reliance and a joy of learning.

Achievements	This goal began with needs analyses performed by faculty, administration and professional consultants. That analysis was undertaken over the previous two academic years and prompted the development of a new enrollment management position. This executive level administrative position was designed to better coordinate and integrate admissions and recruitment, financial aid services, and student success needs. This has now been achieved. Additional staffing and a reorganization of several staffing areas now support this position. This reorganization also freed up present staffing constraints currently inhibiting adequate focus on other mission critical functions outside enrollment management. In addition, the admissions processing unit has been reorganized to review and make decisions on applicant files in a more timely and efficient manner. This reorganization has led to significant increases in early admit decisions over previous years.

Action Plan for Achieving the Goal	A newly created enrollment management position is enabling the opportunity to restructure staffing duties in recruitment and admissions services, and in financial aid services. These efforts are ongoing. They will optimize resources for more effective off-site recruitment; along with more effective communication strategies, and follow up tactics with admits, applicants with incomplete applications, and potential applicants with whom contact has been made. These restructuring efforts will also optimize the processing of applications and application decisions, and the awarding of financial aid and scholarships. This new position, in conjunction with marketing and public relations staff, is enabling a more effective integration of advertising and marketing resources with recruitment and enrollment objectives. New data analytics tools now allow us to better access critical data on applicants and potential applicants. These data are being utilized to develop branding strategies and tactics that optimize marketing the nature and value of the University's services. These new capacities allow us to more effectively reach potential applicant pools outside of the service area while still providing for the mission of USC Sumter to provide excellence in higher education and intellectual leadership in its service area.
Plans for upcoming year	USC Sumter has achieved many of the objectives associated with the planned restructuring of enrollment management process; including in the areas of financial aid, admissions and recruitment, advisement and registration processes, student orientation processes. We have implemented new strategies and tactics toward these ends. We will continue to both assess current processes and make changes where appropriate; and look for opportunities to improve or add to the repertoire of available tactics to improve recruitment and enrollment. We will increase high school visits and engage in enhanced follow-up communication plans to streamline the process for new students, moving prospects to enrollments in a quicker, more efficient and effective manner. We will improve utilization of the CRM, SMS texting, and e-mail and phone campaigns to increase applicants, admits, and new enrollments.

Action Plan for Achieving the Goal

USC Sumter will reestablish a campus presence for the USC Sumter Alumni Council which has been in abeyance for several years. Council, members serve as University Ambassadors at both institutional and community events, organize Alumni events, facilitate Alumni fundraising, and in general help establish and maintain strong stakeholder networks within the University's service area communities. The Council will begin meeting on a more regular basis now that the intuitional commitment necessary to assist them in their objectives has been made. A new newsletter to help encourage participation and new membership in the Alumni Association is being developed as are plans for a more significant involvement in this year's commencement by members of the Alumni Association.

After several years of full-time staffing deficiencies in Alumni Relations, an FTE hire was made in University Development and Alumni Relations. Given the length of time that this administrative function was lacking appropriate staffing, action plan objectives over this next few years will include needs analysis and strategic planning aimed at restructuring the Office of University Advisement capacity to optimize the knowledge, enthusiasm, and resources our alumni provide and enable for all University stakeholders.

USC Sumter shall continue to enhance offerings of non degree continuing education courses for professional development and community interest; and we shall continue to expand summer camps offerings for local secondary school age individuals in the areas of science, liberal arts, and the humanities.

Plans for upcoming year

Based on needs analysis, a second full-time hire was made in University advancement in the Spring of 2019. This will better enable current and upcoming efforts to promote USC Sumter though numerous community channels, to reestablish new processes for scholarship awards and the increase of endowed scholarships. It will also enable the reestablishment better usage of Alumni database resources and alumni interaction.

Action Plan for Achieving the Goal

USC Sumter reorganized its Long-Range Planning Committee in the Spring of 2018 to better facilitate institution-wide planning aimed at assessing and improving academic and student support services, and administrative support services.

The first charge of the newly formatted Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC) is to gather and utilize empirical data on student engagement and student satisfaction to establish goals, objectives, and actions plans to improve academic and student support services, and administrative support services.

The first step in that initiative involves continuation, as one of nearly 1,200 institutional members, of our institutional membership with the Center for Community College Student Engagement out of the University of Texas, Austin, and developing processes for continued administering, of the Center's Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE), and an accompanying institutionally generated student satisfaction survey.. Our second administration of this well-established student engagement instrument occurred in the Spring of 2018, along with the second administration of our own student satisfaction survey. These data, along with data gathered from these surveys' in Spring 2016 give us the beginning of a longitudinal look at our student populations concerning critical areas of student engagement: active and collaborative learning; student effort; academic challenge; studentfaculty interactions; and perceptions of institutional support for learners. They also allow us to assess student satisfaction with several functional areas within the institution.

These data give us invaluable insight into the strengths and weaknesses of our academic and student support services, and administrative support services, leading to more data informed decision-making processes in long range strategic planning.

A newly formulated Palmetto college position gives us more direct working contact with Palmetto College central offices and the Senior System campuses hosting Palmetto College degrees. This allows for the establishment of new networks and relationships to better facilitate alignment with Palmetto College in general, but also with Palmetto planning processes. The new executive level enrollment management position will take an active role on the well-established Palmetto College Implementation team and will shall continue our participation in the Palmetto College Long Range Planning Committee.

Plans for upcoming year	To further embed in the institutional planning processes, assessment methods for continual improvement in administrative support services: to include the business office, facilities management and emergency response management. To build to present a formal recommendation for a Student Success Center and potential changes to related academic and student support services built off assessment processes and analysis of the empirical data gathered from administration of the CCSSE. To administer the 3 rd cycle of the CCSSE survey to aid in future assessments of academic and student support services, and administrative support services, to ensure continual improvement in these mission critical areas.

In the Spring of 2018 USC Sumter was again voted best college in Sumter for the 17th year in a row by Sumter Item Newspaper readers. Experiential Learning for Undergraduates

USC Sumter is actively participating in the USC connect Graduation with Leadership Distinction Program (GLD). The Faculty Organization is facilitating the growth of GLD through faculty service involvement. To facilitate the GLD program USC Sumter faculty has begun teaching the EDLP 520 (Teacher as Manager), UNIV 401 (Senior Capstone Experience), and PCAM 205 (Foundations of Leadership) courses as part of its UNIV 101 Peer Leader Program. USC Sumter has the distinction of graduating the first student and the most students in the program among the PC Campuses.

Affordability

Along with the other PC Campuses USC Sumter continues to offer the lowest rates of tuition in the USC System. USC Sumter continues to waive and subsidize fees for military personnel as needed. USC Sumter granted approximately \$87,000 in private scholarship support over the 2018-2019 Academic Year. Utilizing state Lottery Scholarship funds our new Early College Program allows select, highly qualified high school students an opportunity to earn an Associate degree upon completion of high school, tuition free. Our expanding dual enrollment program offers many other high school students the same tuition free opportunity for up to 24 hours of Carolina Core college credit. Utilizing Lottery Scholarship funds and institutional subsidies our Sumter's Scholars program offers free tuition for first-time fulltime freshman that finished in the top 15% of their high school class cohorts. USC Sumter offers free tutoring, and qualifying students have access to a robust U.S. Department of Education Trios Student Support Services program providing a host of free academic and student support services. USC Sumter strives to keep the cost of services like parking to a minimum.

Reputation Enhancement

Not directly applicable on USC Columbia; though please note sections on Faculty Research and Scholarly Activity, Alumni and Fundraising, Community Perception, and Collaborations, all of which provide activities, programs and initiatives that contribute to reputational enhancement of USC Sumter, USC Columbia and other Senior campuses of the USC System.

Challenges

Increasing enrollment at USC Sumter continues to be a primary focus, and the tuition differential between us and CCTC next door is a monumental hurdle for recruiting students. Many of the students we serve are first generation students who have little experience or understanding of the white-collar job market. Further, they see the promises from CCTC of free tuition, lower admissions standards, and promises of a high paying technical job at a local plant as a better "deal" than a four-year time commitment, paying higher tuition, to get a job they don't have much personal experience with or understanding of (e.g., middle-management, professional services, etc.).

Recruiting students in this climate of competition is difficult, but several things would help. We need to add campus housing to attract a talented student body from across the state to come here, see the careers

that are available in Sumter, and to recognize that Sumter is quickly becoming a destination of choice for major employers. Additional tuition mitigation would help us compete with CCTC—we need to be able to offer the same free-tuition programs as CCTC does. Finally, improved facilities to provide state-of-theart educational experiences would greatly help recruiting and educational efforts.

Research and Scholarly Activity

To this point this academic year, faculty at USC Sumter have produced 5 book chapters, 14 peer review articles and publications, and 1 peer review book review; while making 39 academic conference presentations. There have also be 11 instances of USC Sumter faculty serving as editor or on editorial review boards for peer review publications or serving as referees or judges in a peer reviewed context. Challenges involve striking a balance between teaching, scholarship and service at a campus institutionally organized as a teaching institution. The mission prioritizes teaching and places a demanding teaching load on full-time faculty. Efforts to provide course load reductions and sabbaticals to enhance research productivity continue as resources and circumstances reasonably allow.

Faculty Development

Faculty are offered up to \$1,500 in travel costs each year to present research at Academic Conferences. Faculty are invited to take part in USC Sumter Seminar Series to present their work for feedback. Faculty are encouraged to apply for grants including Aspire, RISE and USC Sumter Summer Stipend to support research projects. Faculty may apply for a course reduction in order to facilitate research. Faculty may apply for a sabbatical to facilitate research. Faculty performing research are honored each year at Faculty Scholarship Reception.

Student Recruitment

Establishing a sustainable student recruitment and onboarding plan has been a top priority for the Enrollment Services group. Increased high school visits and enhanced follow-up communication plans have helped streamline the process for new students, moving prospects to enrollments in a quicker and more efficient manner. Utilization of the CRM, SMS texting, and e-mail and phone campaigns have also contributed to an increase in applicants, admits, and new enrollments.

In addition, the admissions processing unit has been reorganized to review and make decisions on applicant files in a more timely and efficient manner. This reorganization has led to significant increases in early admit decisions over the previous year.

Student Retention

The University of South Carolina is committed to attracting and admitting students who are likely to be successful and who will return to us for a second year (at least). The school offers a number of services and opportunities that are designed to aid in student retention. These efforts are directed both at the academic success of the students as well as their social and cultural development.

From the academic side, USC Sumter offers faculty-led academic advising. Faculty members are paired with students whose professed academic goals align with the training and interests of the faculty. This level of familiarity with both the programs and the students allow for more effective advising on the part of the advisor.

USC Sumter also offers tutoring services free of charge for students in the areas in which many students often struggle. These include, math, the sciences, foreign language, and writing among others. These services are centralized in the Anderson Library with regularly scheduled hours and appointment capability. The use of these services has been strong.

For at-risk students and those suffering from disabilities, USC Sumter has had a Trio program (OSP) operating on campus form many years. This federally-funded program offers additional academic support for students who have met certain eligibility standards. Furthermore, USC Sumter has a dedicated Disability Services coordinator who can offer academic support services for students who have been diagnosed with any disability which impacts their learning.

Campus-wide campaigns through electronic and traditional communication channels have proven successful in promoting early next-term registration and providing effective ongoing follow-up for students who are not enrolled.

The Council meets approximately once a month. A newsletter to help encourage participation and new membership in the Alumni Association is being developed as are plans for community businesses to reward Alumni Association members with discounts. The Alumni Council will also serve lunch at this year's commencement luncheon.

Development, Fundraising and Gifts

Prior to AY 2014-2015, the creation of new endowed scholarships averaged 2-3 per year. In AY 2014-2015 we added 16 new endowed scholarships, and in AY 2015-2016 and AY 2016-2017 we added 8 new endowed scholarships. We are on track for a similar number this year. In addition, in AY 2014-2015 we secured \$500,000 from the State Legislature for the \$7 million Science Building renovation project. Since that time, we raised another \$1.5 million from the State, \$500,000 from the County, \$25,000 each from two local companies and another promised \$100,000 from Palmetto Health Tuomey. We also secured in December 2016 a land donation valued at \$30,000. We secured \$50,000 in funds to serve as "seed" money in a dollar-for-dollar matching program for new endowed scholarships in AY 2015-2016, and another \$50,000 from the same donor with the same aim for AY 2016-2017. We received \$100,000 from the same donor in AY 2017-2018 for the matching program. We are also aggressively seeking grants and donations to go towards the renovation of our auditorium and a new Sim Lab for our newly established Nursing BSN program.

Community Perceptions

USC Sumter is taking a leadership role in promoting the mission of USC Connect and the Graduation with Leadership Distinction. This service-learning oriented strategy creates novel networking opportunities for students, faculty, staff and myriad community actors, and expands upon existing community networks. USC Sumter's Opportunity Scholars Program, a federally funded TRIOS Student Support Services program with a substantive history of community outreach actively supports this process along with mentors organized by the Faculty Organization.

USC Sumter's Athletic Department has a substantive history of providing student athletes opportunities for community interaction and service on myriad levels, including a focus on philanthropic fundraising events and activities.

The location and quality of facilities, and physical and human resources, continue to promote the coordination of active utilization of such resources by local private and public sector organizations such as the Red Cross, the South Carolina Department of Corrections and SAFE Federal Credit Union.

Over the past few years USC Sumter has received several Awards independently solicited and independently evaluated by community members or individuals beyond our campus, city, and state that attest to positive community perceptions of the campus.

In AY 2017-2018 USC Sumter won the Sumter Item's "Best College" award for the 15th time in 16 years. The campus also recently received designation as a Military Friendly School by Victory Media f, recognition of efforts aimed toward military personnel transitioning into civilian life. This is the fourth year in a row that USC Sumter has received this designation. Likewise, USC Sumter was recently designated a STEM Jobs Approved College by the same organization. And for the 2017-2018 Academic Year we also received Victory Media's designments as a Military Friendly Spouse school.

In 2018-2019 USC Sumter began administering a five-year \$1.2 million dollar grant from the U.S. Department of Education to begin a TRIOS Upward Bound Program with a local high school in its service area. As a brand new federal grant, we are currently in the process of developing assessments of resource needs such as staffing and facility needs that upon were not necessarily anticipatable when the grant proposal's plan of action was formulated.

Niche, a website that helps students discover the schools and neighborhoods that are right for them, released its 2019 College Rankings. The University of South Carolina Sumter was named the #5 Best Community College in America. Niche analyzes 4,271 colleges to create rankings and Niche Grades for all aspects of campus life, including academics, student life and value. These rankings and grades are based on rigorous analysis of academic, admissions, financial and student life data from the U.S. Department of Education along with millions of reviews from students and alumni.

In the Fall of 2018 USC Sumter was recognized as Military Friendly School by Victor Media, a national recognition highlighting schools that demonstrate excellence in their efforts to assist military personnel transitioning into civilian life.

In the Spring of 2018 USC Sumter was again voted best college in Sumter for the 17th year in a row by Sumter Item Newspaper readers. More than 100,00 votes from the community were recorded for the 2018 Best of Sumter contest. The Sumter Item Newspaper reaches more than 150,000 unique users each

month through print and digital products and is the primary media outlet for Sumter, Lee and Clarendon counties.

In an effort to open the campus to the community, USC Sumter partnered for the second year in a row with the local farmer's market to provide a location for vendors to sell their farm-to-table goods to residents. Items like organic meats, honey, handmade bird houses, local grown produce and more can be found each Friday on the campus grounds.

USC Sumter has long coordinated with a community-based USC Sumter Associates program, which currently has 65 dues paying members, to share information and updates about campus activities and initiatives, and to channel the solicitation of the community input needed to ensure continuation of our mission.

This year, like each year, we fund and participate in a variety of Chamber of Commerce, Kiwanis and Rotary Club events, and faculty engaged in 78 separate Service activities involving external community stakeholders.

Incentivizing Faculty Engagement

Faculty engagement in teaching, research and service is central to each faculty member's annual, and peer review processes and ultimately serve as the basis of their tenure and promotion decisions. Faculty are provided travel money, many Library resources, including access to USC Columbia holdings, and formal and informal links to institutions in Sumter including, the Sumter County Gallery of Art, the Sumter Little Theatre, the Sumter County Library, the Sumter County Museum, among others.

An endowed grant from the Korn Trust affords faculty from the Division of Arts & Letters funding for various cultural events and the annual sponsorship a public Seminar series. Internal stipends exist to sponsor faculty for summer research projects and initiatives. Active administrative and Faculty Organization leadership exists for the pursuit of RISE grants.

Four endowed Chairs support the exhibition of excellence by USC Sumter faculty: the McDavid Professorship of Business & Economics; the Williams-Brice-Edwards Professor of Social Science; the Julian T. Buxton Professor of Business Administration; and the R.J. "Chic" Mathis Professorship.

Campus Climate

USC Sumter promotes a variety of cultural events along with clubs and organizations that include people from all walks of life. The clubs range from interest groups, political groups, leadership, social, professional, sport, religious, etc.

Student experiences with clubs and organizations build networks spanning beyond peer groups and the classroom to include a broader range of activity with faculty, staff, and external University stakeholders. Extra-curricular activities facilitate exposure to situations enabling growth in intrapersonal skills and team building. Such activities provide situation contexts broadening social networks to ameliorate daily interactions on campus and during planned events. Thus, such activities channel a camaraderie among diverse stakeholders into a sustainable campus community.

Each year Student Life promotes and hosts several social events for students, staff and faculty, along with monthly events designed to engage extra and co-curricular activities and a campus "community" of peers. Student involvement continues to improve each semester. As new students join returning students, Student Life capitalizes on the campus excitement and continues to offer engaging activities. Through all clubs and organizations Student Life can "take the pulse" of the campus and add programs that students want and need. Student involvement in campus decision making is critical to mission objectives and a

sustainable campus community. To improve involvement proactive efforts to bolster Student Government and build a stronger Student Activities Board are key focuses for the upcoming year.

Each year our OSP program enables students to attend a Student Leadership & Diversity Conference at on the USC Columbia campus and provides funds for wide variety of students to attend the SC Day at the State House. Each year student Life promotes and holds several social mixers for students, staff and faculty, along with monthly events designed to engage extra and co-curricular activities and a campus "community" of peers.

This year we continued our annual Martin Luther King Day Walk with the campus community and other Sumter community stakeholders. We held poetry readings and faculty seminars associated with topics extending to inclusivity and barriers to inclusivity. We are hosting a Student Leadership Conference in May of 2019 that will involve students in our OSP program, our Global Leadership Distinction program and our Early College program. Currently we plan to continue offering this Student Leadership Conference opportunity every other year in the future.

New student life events are being developed and improved upon, including: Late Night, Bonfire, Movie Nights, Bowling. We expect to have (or had) large student contingents representing USC Sumter at community events: Christmas Parade, Dream Walk, Carolina Day, Halloween Carnival and we hosted a successful Thanksgiving Lunch for students, faculty, and staff.

More than a half dozen very active clubs/orgs. on campus: CCM, Game Club, Apeiron Society, Y.A.L., Spanish Club, I.R.I.S., Arm Wrestling/Grip Club. The University Ambassadors organization continued to grow and transition students into GLD. USC Sumter added on-campus student counseling provided by a licensed counselor.

Cool Stuff

This year was the second year of our new women's golf and men's soccer teams. Also, it was the second year of operating agreements with City and County officials for facility usage for baseball, softball, tennis and golf.

This past year USC Sumter continued and grew its new eSports program. The USC Sumter Varsity eSports program provides a competitive environment for students to participate in a variety of games across the intercollegiate landscape. The program growth improved to 20 plus students on the roster and 5 games played. The Overwatch team finished in the final four of a national tournament through NACE. USC Sumter continued partnership with E-Blue and formed a new partnership with ByteSpeed/Gravity Gaming. The first USC Sumter eSports scholarships were awarded. Other SC schools start eSports programs, researched USC Sumter: USC Union, Newberry College, USC Aiken, Lander University, Coker College

Two years ago, we donated property on Theater Drive to the City of Sumter to expand their Tennis Center with plans for the City to help in the construction of a softball field on adjacent property that we own at an appropriate time in the future. Early movement on those projects began last year and continues into this academic year.

This year USC Sumter is putting forth a formal proposal for a plan to develop a food pantry, and clothing and toiletries repository for students who find themselves in need of basic necessities, and in particular for our growing body of international students. Our goal is to create a system of outdoor and indoor food and supply dispensaries, which would serve as an all-encompassing food pantry to accommodate that 50% of USC Sumter students who suffer from severe financial burdens, easing the weight of daily financial stressors thereby making it easier for them to be successful in college and on into the future. The plan calls for this to be operated by student life with hopes of future work-study staffing and incorporation into service-learning projects for a series of classes, to include our Global Leadership Program efforts.

50 physical plant and facilities enhancement projects have been completed since June 2018, including work in the following buildings: ADMIN: Remove old boiler; Nettles: Repair wall (water intrusion); Nettles: New chiller; ADMIN: LED lights interior and exterior; Library: LED lights interior and exterior; BADM: Remove old boiler. Repair have been made to: potholes in various parking lots; Pool and fountains; roof repairs, AC repairs, ceiling repairs; and Soccer field fence. We have made several kitchen renovations (ADMIN, SUB, Nettles, A&L) and numerous IT upgrades.

Science lab renovations are actively occurring, and there are several planned upcoming projects that include: monument and signage, parking lot upgrades, BADM heat pumps, campus wide LED conversion, and a new telephone (VIOP) system.

USC Sumter continues to excel, and outpace almost all of its in-state peer institutions, in success rates and transfer-out rates; while its 6 year 150% time Baccalaureate graduation rates continues to be comparable to its aspirational peers and many South Carolina public 4 year comprehensive institutions of higher education.






