USC AIKEN PALMETTO COLLEGE PROGRAM SPECIFICS

In addition to the required courses listed on the previous pages, the USC Aiken Palmetto Special Education Degree Completion Program has other requirements to complete the degree and meet state certification standards. In addition, there are certain technological requirements necessary to be successful in the program.

UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS

These are requirements all USC Aiken students must complete in order to be eligible for graduation. Some requirements are adapted for Palmetto College students.

- Non-Western Requirement: All USCA students are required to take one course considered Non-Western. Ideally, this requirement is met with another required course. However, if you have transferred courses into all of the areas where this requirement can be met, you will have to take a separate Non-Western course. Your Palmetto College Advisor will help you identify areas where this requirement can be met.
- Writing Intensive (WI): USC Aiken Palmetto College students are required to complete two
 Writing Intensive courses once ENGL 101 and 102 are complete. As is the case with the NonWestern, this requirement should be combined with courses you already need. Your advisor
 will notify you which courses are Writing Intensive. This requirement can only be met through
 USC Aiken. In addition, this requirement must be completed before you may apply for the
 Internship Program.
- Inter-Curricular Enrichment (ICE): These are lectures and other events delivered online. USC Aiken Palmetto College students need to complete a maximum of eight ICE events over the course of the program. Although, fewer may be required based on pre-USC Aiken credits hours. Students receive credit by viewing podcasts and submitting a written description of the lecture/event. This requirement can only be met through USC Aiken.
- Writing Proficiency Requirement: All USC Aiken students must demonstrate an ability to write
 on a collegiate level. To meet this requirement, you must submit a writing portfolio (three
 papers previously written and one reflective essay). Student who do not pass the Writing
 Portfolio must take ENGL 201: Writing in the University. Your Palmetto College advisor will
 discuss this in more detail as you move through the program. In addition, this requirement
 must be completed before you may apply for the Internship Program.

PROFESSIONAL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

These are requirements all USC Aiken education majors must complete in order to be admitted to and continue in the School of Education Professional Program.

- Complete PRAXIS Core Exam: Education Majors are required to pass all three sections (math, writing, and reading) of the Praxis Core Test before being admitted to the professional program. Applicants who have an 1100 on the 2-part SAT, 1650 on the 3-part SAT, or 24 on the ACT are exempt from taking the Praxis I exam. Find out more on the School of Education webpage.
- Submit Professional Program Application: The baccalaureate curricula of the School of
 Education are divided into general education and professional training. Any student who fulfills
 the admission requirements of the University may enroll in the pre-professional curriculum.
 Curricula designated as professional education courses are limited to candidates who have been
 formally accepted into the USC Aiken Professional Education Program. The Program Advisor
 will provide more information as the student approaches this deadline.
- Complete PRAXIS II Exams: The Praxis II Subject Area Exam(s) and the Principles of Teaching & Learning (PLT) exams must be passed <u>prior to state teacher certification</u>. It is recommended that teacher candidates take the Subject Area exam(s) prior to internship and the PLT during internship.
- Apply for Internship (student teaching): Students are required to complete 12 Internship credit
 hours. This is required for the degree and state certification. Students in the Palmetto College
 Program may complete the internship in a school in which they are working or in a school in
 their area. The Director of Field Experience will assist students with finding placements. Find
 out more on the <u>School of Education webpage</u>.
