PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to establish and inform the University of South Carolina Community of the guidelines governing registration and parking of bicycles on campus.

DEFINITIONS

Parking & Transportation Services (PTS)

POLICY STATEMENT

It is the policy of the University to require the registration of all bicycles on campus.

PROCEDURES

- A. All bicycles parked on campus MUST be registered with Parking Services.
 - 1. Bicycles may be registered online at: https://sc.edu/about/offices_and_divisions/parking/index.php
 - 2. Bicycles may be registered at the Parking Services office.
- B. Bicycles found to be unregistered for over 72 hours are subject to confiscation.
- C. When unattended, all bicycles must be properly secured to a bicycle rack.
 - 1. Bicycles cannot be secured to objects such as handrails, meters, or street signs.
 - 2. Any bicycle attached to these, or similar objects will be subject to immediate confiscation.
- D. Confiscation by Parking and Transportation Services
- E. Parking and Transportation Services
 - 1. Reserves the right to remove:
 - a. Any bicycle meeting the above conditions; or

b. Any bicycle deemed unsafe or abandoned.

F. Parking and Transportation Services

- 1. is not responsible for any damage caused during the removal of a bicycle.
- 2. Confiscated bicycles will be held for 120 days. After 120 days, the bicycle will be considered abandoned property and may be disposed of in accordance with South Carolina Law.
- 3. Bicycles may be claimed by providing verification of ownership.
- 4. (PTS) and UofSC are not responsible for any damage or theft of registered and unregistered bicycles.
