The Department of Anthropology seeks undergraduate student essay submissions for the **Dr. Ann Kingsolver Student Achievement Award**.

<u>Eligibility Criteria</u>: The student must be a full-time undergraduate who is an Anthropology major or minor.

<u>Essay Topic</u>: The award involves submitting a short essay exploring what anthropology means to you. For guidance, you can use the following question:

Why did you choose to major or minor in Anthropology, and what does Anthropology mean to you?

<u>Essay Format</u>: The essay should be a maximum of 3 pages single-spaced with 1-inch margins. It can be shorter. The required font should be 12-point Times New Roman. Include your name and title of the essay as a header on the first page only. Include page numbers in the footer of each page.

The essays will be adjudicated by a panel comprised of faculty representing the four fields, so students of any subfield or area of study are encouraged to submit. Essays will be judged on content and style. By style we mean free of typos, not that it needs to conform to a particular form of English or formal essay structure. In fact, creativity in structure and content is encouraged. Citations are not required, but if you want to reference any influential works, you can certainly include them.

The winning essay will receive the award and a cash prize of \$100.00. The winner will be announced on **World Anthropology Day** which falls on the third Thursday in February, which for 2022 is **February 17, 2022**.
