In March 1850, five men and two women were photographed partially naked in the studio of the Columbia, South Carolina artist Joseph T. Zealy. Gregg Hecimovich, professor of English at Furman University, will share his detective work uncovering the lives and times of seven enslaved Americans as part of this current ensemble biography project.
