BOOK MANUSCRIPT

Ultimate Witness: Police Body Cameras and the Production of Truth

While certain body camera images are spectacularly visible, the systems that produce, manage, and distribute them tend to remain out of sight. In this project, I argue for a shift in our approach to police video: from "what does this image say?" to "what are the conditions of possibility for its speaking?" By adopting a media industries approach, I document how a technology that claims to speak objective truth can reinforce racialized histories of vision and meaning-making.
