The Bridge Humanities Corps program aims to provide advanced doctoral students (ABD) and newly minted PhDs in the humanities with advanced pedagogical training and professional development programming. Corps members are awarded a stipend, tuition abatement for special enrollment (as applicable), and health insurance. Corps members teach sections of SAEL 200, or its Carolina Core equivalent, over the course of the 2019-2020 academic year.
