

NACC Seeking a State Coordinator

The National Association of Counsel for Children is seeking state coordinators to help lead outreach efforts and provide support to practitioners in their respective states. Responsibilities include serving as a liaison between NACC and child welfare practitioners, courts, and law schools; growing the community of NACC members and Child Welfare Law Specialists; submitting quarterly updates and participating in quarterly calls; planning at least one annual event; and attending the NACC National Conference. The time commitment is approximately 5 hours per month. Compensation includes a \$500 stipend; NACC membership; NACC National Child Welfare Conference registration; Red Book Training Course registration; and coaching, resources, and materials to support this role. Qualifications include 5+ years' experience as a dependency attorney and preference is given to Child Welfare Law Specialists. The deadline to apply is April 5, 2021.
