### Are you curious about research opportunities?

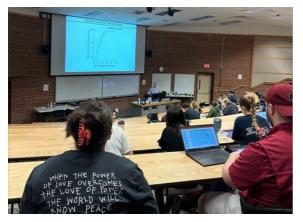

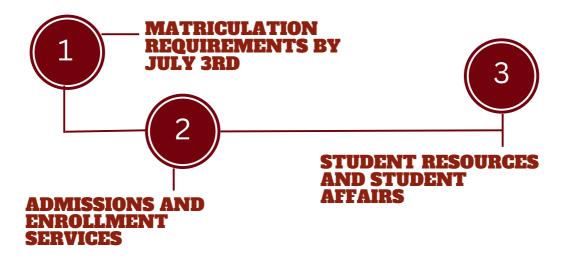
