- Nearly 600 volunteers give their time each year
- The clinic offers medical and dental care, including preventative gynecology care, ophthalmology care, and other specialized medical services
- Health education classes on topics including diabetes management, women's health, smoking cessation, and others
- Medications for treatment and management of most chronic and acute illnesses
