#### Scope

University of South Carolina (USC) School of Medicine Greenville students

### **Policy Statement**

This policy governs the consumption, possession, distribution, and sale of alcoholic beverages (including beer, wine, and distilled spirits) on the USC School of Medicine Greenville campus for student-sponsored events. In compliance with the Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act of 1989, the USC School of Medicine Greenville places significant value on the concept of healthy and responsible decision-making for all members of the community. The University supports strict enforcement of South Carolina's laws in regard to the consumption, possession and sale of alcoholic beverages. This policy also applies to every student sponsored function or event, including but not limited to receptions, dinners, banquets and campus wide activities sponsored by organizations or individuals associated with the USC School of Medicine Greenville.

The USC School of Medicine Greenville has determined that students must not carry or consume alcohol in any University building or open space.

For events sponsored by non-student entities and off-campus events, alcohol can be consumed by those 21 years of age or older but must be purchased and served through the contract of a licensed third-party vendor.
