Required travel documents at your own expense for the program include: (1) a valid passport with a minimum of six (6) months validity after date of return from Africa with at least 4-6 blank visa pages, and (2) the purchase of a KAZA UNIVISA (currently \$50 USD, good for multiple entries into Zambia and Zimbabwe) upon arrival at the Livingstone, Zambia airport. Note: Please consult your nearest applicable consulate concerning tourist visa requirements if you are not a U.S. passport holder.
