Graduate String Quartet

As a featured student chamber ensemble, the quartet presents performances on campus and in selected regional venues. Members participate in the University Symphony Orchestra and receive stipends of up to \$6,000 during the nine-month academic year (tuition abatements may boost the value of the position beyond \$25,000).

Other String Assistantships

Stipends for work with the *USC Symphony Orchestra* and *USC String Project* (a nationally recognized program) range up to \$6,000 (plus tuition abatements) per academic year.

Additional Performance Opportunities

Qualified applicants may audition for the South Carolina Philharmonic Orchestra as well as nearby professional orchestras in Augusta (GA), Charlotte (NC), and Charleston (SC).
