“Advancing lung cancer screening and quality survivorship: current projects in South Carolina”



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Profile

Lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer death in the U.S. among both men and women. Lung cancer screening is a promising prevention strategy for patients at risk for lung cancer due to prolonged smoking. In 2014, a multidisciplinary group of faculty from the University of South Carolina established a research agenda focused on the implementation of lung cancer screening programs in South Carolina and nationwide. One of their goals was to survey health care providers regarding their knowledge of lung cancer screening guidelines, attitudes towards screening in community settings, referral practices and associated barriers. In this presentation, Dr. Jan Eberth will discuss the rationale and implementation of this national survey of primary care providers and nurse practitioners. She will also discuss the development of the Partners in Quality Lung Cancer Survivorship stakeholder model.
