The Arnold School of Public Health at the University of South Carolina is vital to the health and well-being of children and adults throughout the Palmetto State and beyond. The only accredited school of public health in South Carolina, the Arnold School touches every community in the state and citizens from all walks of life through its prevention, intervention, and rehabilitation programs and services.

The University of South Carolina's School of Public Health was established in 1975 and has experienced continuous growth and excellence over the past four decades. In 2000, it was named for Columbia business leader Norman J. Arnold and his wife, Gerry Sue, who established a \$10 million endowment to support the teaching, research, and public education efforts of the School. The Arnold School makes an impact through the efforts of our faculty, researchers, students, alumni, and partners who work to improve the health of people, communities, and the environment—statewide and worldwide.

In the fall of 2019, more than 3,000 graduate and undergraduate students were enrolled in our academic programs. Since 2009, extramural research and non-research grants and contracts to Arnold School researchers have garnered more than \$334 million, with much of the funding from leading federal agencies and prestigious foundations.

The Arnold School has been a leader in the development of the University of South Carolina's Innovista research district on the university's main campus in the state's capitol city. The Public Health Research Center on Assembly Street houses research facilities and the Dean's administrative offices. Additionally, the Discovery building on Greene Street provides the labs and offices of many of the School's leading researchers. These facilities are a testament to the outstanding research programs for which the Arnold School is nationally and internationally recognized.
